

Emergencies

Suspect Packages

If you or one of your passengers discovers a suspicious package or bag in your vehicle, you should evacuate the vehicle immediately. Passengers should be asked to move well away from the vehicle. Please contact the police immediately (telephone 999 or 112), and then advise your Controller of the situation. You must not use a mobile telephone within 25 metres of the vehicle – use land lines to contact the police and your depot. **DO NOT USE THE VEHICLE'S RADIO**. You should follow any instructions given to you by the police, and identify yourself to the first police officer arriving at the scene.

Fires

In the event of a fire in your vehicle, you should evacuate the vehicle immediately. Passengers should be asked to move well away from the vehicle. Please contact the police and fire brigade immediately (telephone 999 or 112), and then advise your Controller of the situation. You should follow any instructions given to you by the police or fire brigade, and identify yourself to the first officer arriving at the scene.

Low Bridge Strikes

You should contact Network Rail and the police immediately in the event of a collision with a railway bridge, even if the contact only appears to be slight. Details of the bridge's identification and the relevant contact number for Network Rail will be displayed on a plate on or near the bridge. Telephone 999 or 112 to contact the police. You must also advise your Controller of the situation. Please follow any instructions given to you by the police or Network Rail, and identify yourself to the first officer arriving at the scene.

Diversions

You will usually be advised by either CentreComm (London Buses) or your depot if there is a diversion in place that affects you. However, if you unexpectedly discover that a road you would normally use is blocked, you should contact your Controller for advice. **Never leave line of route unless you are following an alternative route that is suitable for your vehicle** (as described by CentreComm or your Controller).

Emergency Radio Procedure (Code Red)

If you require the Emergency Services to attend your vehicle (for example in the event of passenger injury, assault or major RTA), you should contact CentreComm using the radio's Code Red facility. To call CentreComm, hold down the Code Red button on your vehicle's radio for at least 1 second (until you hear a ringing tone to indicate that your call has been connected).

Once your call has been answered, you do not need to press any other button on the radio. Hold down the foot switch in the cab when you are speaking, and end what you have to say with the word "over" to indicate that you expect a response, or "over and out" if this is the end of your communication. Release the foot switch when you are not speaking. Remember to speak slowly and clearly. Note that you will usually receive a radio call from your depot shortly after you make a Code Red call.

You should not use the radio whilst the vehicle is in motion.

You must not use the radio to report the presence of a suspect package (see opposite page).

Local Hazards

Orpington Station

You should switch off your engine whilst on stand in Orpington Bus Station. Please exercise caution when reversing into the parking bays.

Orpington High Street

Orpington is a busy shopping centre. Please be aware that pedestrians may step into the road unexpectedly, particularly when serving Orpington High Street.


St. Mary Cray

Several of the roads used on this route are narrow, with parked cars on both sides. Please keep to an appropriate speed, and be prepared to give way to oncoming traffic where necessary. Also note that St. Mary Cray High Street has speed humps.

Curtailment Points

Orpington Bus Station

Set down passengers at the bus stop at the top of Station Approach. Turn right at the mini-roundabout, then follow the access road round to the left to enter the bus station. Take any excess stand time in one of the parking bays at the rear of the bus station. Pick up passengers from the bus bay furthest from the station (as shown), then continue straight ahead down Station Approach to exit.
